

American Pie Star's Auteur Debut Sells Out at Vail Film Festival

Thomas and his real life brother Tim Scarne teamed up to write, produce, act, direct, and edit this project. Their feature film *LA DJ* had an overwhelming positive response from moviegoers of all ages, film critics, and film makers who were all in attendance for the world premiere.

Their concept was to use the Internet to broadcast their DJ set live on their website, TheWorldParty.com, "One world, one beat, one party, one dollar, Log on and party with the world." Unfortunately only four people signed up.

When their Uncle Marty is hospitalized, they get an opportunity to go to L.A. The brothers discover a DJ spin-off. Tim and Thom try their best to enter the competition to win. But the only gigs they play in LA are Bar Mitzvahs. In a twist of fate, they learn their relationship is more important than any gig.

LA DJ features cameo's from the late Jam Master Jay, DMC, DJ Carl Cox, and Original music by Dave Audè.

LA DJ involved the entire town of Vail, by throwing the *LA DJ* pre party, *LA DJ* after premiere party, holding an *LA DJ* Press Conference, featured in every major media outlet, having to turn away people from the screening and have them come to a second private screening. Thomas Ian Nicholas also performed a surprise concert Saturday night at a local bar where hundreds of fans appeared when they heard the news of the performance. ■
